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What is WEDI?

♦ Workgroup for Electronic Data Interchange

- Established 1991
- Named advisor to HHS under HIPAA
- Represents broad cross-section of healthcare industry
- Objective collaborative approach to addressing issues



Summary observations

◆ Main Points

- SDOs write business rules for data content and usage
- Operating Rule entities write operational business rules not associated with data content
- Claim Attachments need to be implemented to reduce costs and time to process claims benefits providers and payers
- Need acknowledgements too
- Developing SDOs are harmonizing standards together today
- Many meaningful use documents will be useful to health plans as claim attachment, and can be shared in the same format
- Need to support the Patient Information Unstructured Content
- WEDI can be a valuable agent identifying new or modified requirements for Claim Attachment standards and operating rules



What is the current status of development of standards for attachments and implementation specifications? What is the timing for development and testing standards?

- WEDI defers to the SDOs for specifics on this point, although we do understand that:
 - The ASC X12 275 and 277 transactions v5010 are ready
 - HL7 Attachment –Information Specifications for CDA Release
 2 are near completion
 - Two pilots were done
 - Earlier pilot used CDA Release 1 and PDF documents (Empire)
 - Second pilot used CDA Release 2 (Mayo and WPS)
 - There is a pilot running now at UHIN for Prior Authorization
 - Both the Empire and Mayo/WPS pilots have demonstrated positive returns to both the provider and payers
 - Reduces cost and time to payment



Where do you see the standards for attachments going? How are these standards being harmonized with the standards developed/adopted for exchange of clinical information under the Meaningful Use program?

- Claim Attachments will continue to be needed
 - New attachment types, many are already identified
 - Use with Authorizations and Referrals
- Harmonization between standards
 - Is currently being done between the SDOs
 - Has been a joint effort between X12, HL7, NCPDP, DeCC
- Other uses with Meaningful Use and ...
 - The actual attachment information in the BIN Segment being a CDA allows for a variety of uses
 - Is consistent with document exchanges defined for MU today
 - Use of CDA Templates offers future opportunities
 - Use of Unstructured Documents, e.g., PIUC or CDA with unstructured documents defined by Consolidated Guide & LOINC



Are all the "priority" areas identified by provider and payers being addressed in the development of the standards?

High priority areas

- It would seem that 80% of the high priority items have been identified
- During our Fall Conference attachment types were identified that would be most useful; many among those are already defined:
 - Lab Results
 - X-Ray Report
 - Sterilization Forms
 - Information on Modifiers
 - OB Claims supporting doc

- Discharge statements
- Emergency Room Records
- Care Plans (medical home)
- Progress Reports (Rehab)
- First Report of Injury (W/C)



Which areas might not be addressed? What other gaps have been identified? How can those gaps be addressed?

- Areas not addressed and how to address them
 - Suggest the use of the PIUC
 - Add LOINC codes to support new needs without changing the standards
 - Unstructured documents can be a short term solution
 - Allows an opportunity to learn more about requirements
 - Can be used while a structured CDA can be developed
 - A good stop gap tool to consider for adoption for this purpose
 - Pharmacy and Dental requirements
 - Future requirements claim vs attachment
 - Needs an industry process
 - WEDI could play a valuable role in this work



What is the current status of common business rules (operating rules) for the requirement or submission of attachments in the industry?

- Currently there are no Operating Rules other than the Implementation Specifications defined by X12 and HL7
 - These business rules primarily define data content rules
 - Operational rules are missing
 - Acknowledgements (999, 277 and 824)
- ◆ For HIEs and NwHIN and DSNs we are seeing the equivalent of operating rules for document exchanges that might include attachment types
 - Direct and IHE



What are the areas where national standard business rules/operating rules for requiring/submitting attachments would be most beneficial?

◆National Operating Rules

- Would be helpful in defining operational business rules
 - Communication protocols
 - Security requirements
 - Hours of operation
 - Other business rules not associated with data content or data structure
 - Define when claim attachments should be sent or not sent
 - Help with the timing of solicited versus unsolicited attachments



One of the responsibilities of the Committee is to identify an authoring entity for national operating rules for claim attachments; would you be pursuing designation as an authoring entity?

- WEDI is not pursuing the designation of an authoring operating rule entity
- ◆ WEDI believes it can provide a valuable role to the SDOs and the Operating Rules entities by:
 - Bringing the industry together for topic forums
 - Identifying areas needing attention
 - Providing outreach and education on implementation
- Whoever the entity is for Claim Attachments
 - They must be collaborative and work together with the SDO
 - The SDOs and the Operating Rule Entities must have a delineation of responsibilities to avoid conflicting rules
